



## **Ballinger Open Space Restoration Project Operator Declaration of Planting**

I, the undersigned Project Operator for the Planting Project named Ballinger Open Space Restoration, located at NE 200<sup>th</sup> St and 24<sup>th</sup> Ave NW, Shoreline, WA 98125, and submitted to City Forest Credits by application dated June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020, declare the following in order to confirm the planting of trees under this Project:

- Trees planted were not required by any law or ordinance to be planted;
- Trees were planted under this project on the following dates:

**December 1, 2018** → 25 Douglas fir, 25 Sitka spruce, 75 Western redcedar, 10 Cascara, 25 Black cottonwood, 50 Pacific willow, and 85 shrubs. **Total = 210 Trees**

**May 14, 2019** → 107 black cottonwood live stakes and 50 shrubs

**November 5, 2019** → 37 potted plants installed

**November 6, 2019** → 188 potted plants installed

**December 5, 2019** → 148 potted plants and 550 live stakes installed

**December 7, 2019** → 201 potted plants installed

**December 17, 2019** → 30 potted plants installed

**December 20, 2019** → 46 potted plants installed

**Fall of 2019 Total** → 100 Douglas fir, 200 Sitka spruce, 150 Western redcedar, 50 Cascara, 50 Red alder, 307 Black cottonwood, 350 Pacific willow, and 100 shrubs. **Total = 1,207 trees**

**Total to Date = 1,417 trees (and 235 shrubs)**

- The organizations or groups that participated in the planting event(s) are listed in the attached documents;
- Planting events are shown in photos attached, which can include photos of tree stock and planting activities;
- The number of trees planted by species are, to a reasonable certainty, **1,417 trees**.


125 Douglas fir, 225 Sitka spruce, 225 Western redcedar, 60 Cascara, 50 Red alder, 332 Black cottonwood, and 400 Pacific willow.

These planting numbers are confirmed by one or more of the following supporting and attached documents:

1. Invoices for trees planted, or
2. Invoices or a statement from the party who funded the tree purchase or supplied the trees attesting to the number of trees purchased, or
3. Planting lists compiled contemporaneously with or after the planting event(s), or

4. Any reporting to the owner or public body regarding the planting, invoices, costs, or other data re the planting, or
5. Any other reliable estimate of trees planted that is approved by the Registry
